European Corporate Bond Fund, a Euro denominated sub fund of the Standard Life Investments Global SICAV, A Acc Hedged GBP Shares (ISIN: LU0741089899). This fund is managed by Aberdeen Standard Investment Luxembourg S.A.

OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

Investment Objective

The Fund aims to provide long term growth from capital gains and the reinvestment of income by investing in European investment grade corporate bonds.

The Fund aims to outperform the iBoxx Euro Corporates Index (EUR) benchmark before charges.

Investment Policy

Portfolio Securities

- The Fund invests predominantly in Euro denominated investment grade debt and debt-related securities issued by corporations.

- The Fund may invest in a wide range of bonds (e.g. corporate bonds including high yield bonds, government backed securities, overseas bonds, index-linked bonds, floating rate notes (FRNs) and asset backed securities (ABSs) and/or money market instruments) in order to take advantage of opportunities identified by our investment team. Non euro denominated assets held in the Fund will generally be hedged back to euros.

- The Fund may also invest in other transferable securities, moneymarket instruments, deposits, cash and near cash, derivatives (including currency forwards, interest rate and credit default swaps) and collective investment schemes.

Management Process

- The Fund is actively managed.

- The benchmark is used as a reference point for portfolio

construction and as a basis for setting risk constraints.
- In order to achieve its objective, the Fund will take positions whose weightings diverge from the benchmark or invest in securities which are not included in the benchmark. The investments of the Fund may deviate significantly from the components and their weightings in

the benchmark.

- Due to the Fund's risk constraints, its performance profile is not ordinarily expected to deviate significantly from that of the benchmark over the longer term.

Derivatives and Techniques

- The Fund will routinely use derivatives to reduce risk or cost, or to generate additional capital or income at proportionate risk (Efficient Portfolio Management) or to meet its investment objective. Derivatives may be used to provide market exposures different to those that could be achieved through investment in assets in which the fund is primarily invested. Usage of derivatives is monitored to ensure that the fund is not exposed to excessive or unintended risks.

Investors in the fund may buy and sell shares on any dealing day (as defined in the Prospectus).

If you invest in income shares, income from investments in the fund will be paid out to you. If you invest in accumulation shares, income will be added to the value of your shares.

Recommendation: the fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within five years. Investors should satisfy themselves that their attitude to risk aligns with the risk profile of this fund before investing.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



This indicator reflects the volatility of the fund's share price over the last five years which in turn reflects the volatility of the underlying assets in which the fund invests. Historical data may not be a reliable indication for the future.

The fund is rated as 3 because of the extent to which the following risk factors apply:

- The fund invests in mortgage and asset-backed securities (which may include collateralised loan, debt or mortgage obligations (respectively CLOs, CDOs or CMOs)). These are subject to prepayment and extension risk and additional liquidity and default risk compared to other credit securities. risk compared to other credit securities.
- The fund invests in securities which are subject to the risk that the issuer may default on interest or capital payments.
- The use of derivatives carries the risk of reduced liquidity, substantial loss and increased volatility in adverse market conditions, such as a failure amongst market participants. The use of derivatives may result in the fund being leveraged (where market exposure and thus the potential for loss by the fund exceeds the amount it has invested) and in these market conditions the effect of leverage will be to magnify losses.


