What is this product?

Type

This product is an investment fund.

Term

The Fund is established for an unlimited duration, with the possibility for the Board of Directors to decide the termination of the Fund at its sole discretion.

Objectives

Blackrock Euro Government ESG Bonds belongs to the category of Single Manager Funds.

The Fund seeks to increase the value of its assets over the medium term by investing predominantly in euro denominated bonds and securities treated as equivalent to bonds issued or guaranteed by a member state of the European Union being part of the euro zone such as fixed-income and floating rate bonds. There will be no rating constraints as regards investments in these assets.

The minimum asset allocation in such securities will be of 60% of the Fund's net assets.

In addition, the Fund may invest up to 40% of its total net assets in other bonds or securities. The Fund may not invest in defaulted assets and/or distressed assets. The sub-fund may invest up to 20% in bank deposits at sight, including cash held in current accounts with a bank accessible at any time.

Sustainable Investment Policy The sub-fund promotes environmental and social characteristics and qualifies as an investment product in accordance with article 8(1) of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 on sustainability related disclosures in the financial services sector as set out in Book I.

In that respect, the eligible universe is determined by using the proprietary ESG framework (including various ESG providers) of the external Investment Manager combining:

- Exclusion filters: the purpose of these filters is to exclude issuers and activities from the initial universe that might have a negative effect on society and environment or human rights (activities and norm-based exclusions). When it comes to consider Corporates bonds, On this basis, are excluded certain controversial activities such as, but not limited to, weapons production, tobacco producers and sellers, GMOs, gambling, adult entertainment, cannabis for recreational purpose, art drilling, shale gas, oil sands, coal mining, fur and specialty leather etc. (subject to certain thresholds as per Book I, Article 8+). Issuers involved in serious human rights violation and environmental damage are also excluded. When it comes to consider Government bonds, are excluded

bonds from countries that have not ratified the international treaties listed as per Book I, Article 8+. The sub-fund may apply additional exclusions from the core sustainable investment policy of the External Investment Managers.

- A Best in class (Corporates) /Best in Universe (Countries) approach or (selectivity approach): in that respect, the sub-fund identifies and selects issuers that better manage their ESG risk better ESG issues than their reference peer group.

For the avoidance of doubt, Supra-national organizations and Euro denominated Government bonds within Euro zone securities are, to date, eligible with the Management Company's Sustainable Investment Policy.

The extra-financial analysis covers at least 90% of the portfolio.

The derivative instruments are not covered by the ESG analysis.

Relation to the Reference Portfolio This Fund is actively managed and is compared to the ICE BofAML 1-10 Year Euro Government Index for performance and risk level indicator purposes. However, the reference to this Reference Portfolio does not constitute any objective or limitation in the management and composition of the portfolio and the Fund does not restrain its universe to the Reference Portfolio's components.

The Reference Portfolio does not evaluate or include its constituents on the basis of environmental and/or social characteristics and is therefore not aligned with the ESG characteristics promoted by the sub-fund.

The base currency of the Fund is EUR.

Income is systematically reinvested.

Investors are able to redeem on a daily basis (on Luxembourg bank business days).

Intended retail investor

This product is intended for investors who plan to stay invested for at least 3 years and are prepared to take on a low level of risk of loss to their original capital in order to get a higher potential return. It is designed to form part of a portfolio of investments.

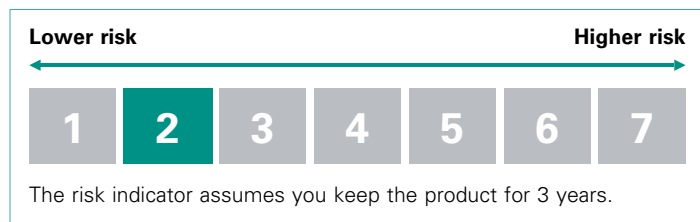

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risks

Performance scenarios

What happens if ABN AMRO Funds Blackrock Euro Government ESG Bonds is unable to pay out?

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, a depositary. Should we default, the depositary would liquidate the investments and distribute the proceeds to the investors. In the worst case, however, you could lose your entire investment.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario,
- 10,000 EUR is invested.

Recommended holding period: 3 years
