Objectives and Investment Policy

Franklin Flexible Alpha Bond Fund (the “Fund”), which pursues an actively managed investment strategy, aims to earn income and to increase the value of its investments over the medium to long term in excess of the FTSE 3-Month US Treasury Bill Index over a full market cycle (being a period of time that spans a full business and economic cycle, which may include periods of rising and declining interest rates).

The Fund invests mainly directly or indirectly (through derivatives) in a wide range of debt securities of any maturity, duration or quality (including investment grade, low-rated, unrated securities and/or up to 10% of the Fund’s net assets in securities in default) issued by governments, government-related entities and corporations located in any country. The Fund’s portfolio may include high yield (“junk”) bonds, distressed debt securities (securities of companies that are, or are about to be, involved in reorganisations, financial restructurings, or bankruptcy), convertible securities or contingent convertible securities (investments in contingent convertible securities will not exceed 5% of the Fund’s net assets), mortgage and other asset-backed securities as well as credit-linked securities that derive their value from an index. The Fund can also invest in units of other mutual funds and in Mainland China through the Bond Connect or directly (each limited to 10% of assets).

The Fund also intends to regularly invest in currencies and currency related financial derivative instruments as a hedging technique or to implement a

currency investment strategy.

The Fund can use derivatives for hedging, efficient portfolio management and/or investment purposes.

The benchmark of the Fund is the Linked FTSE 3-Month US T-Bill Index. The benchmark has been selected because the target return of the Fund is to exceed the return of the benchmark. Although the Investment Manager refers to the benchmark for performance measurement purposes, the Fund is not obliged to hold any of the benchmark constituents and may indeed invest up to 100% of its net assets outside the Benchmark.

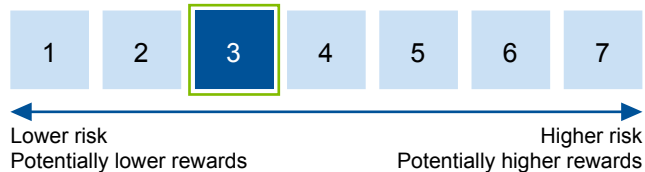
The income received from the Fund’s investments is accumulated with the result of increasing the value of the shares.

Terms to Understand

Hedging: A strategy for totally or partially offsetting particular risks such as those arising from fluctuations in share prices, currencies or interest rates.

Why is the Fund in this specific category?

The Fund seeks to generate attractive risk-adjusted returns over a full market cycle by investing mainly directly or indirectly (through derivatives) in a wide range of debt securities. Such securities and investment instruments have historically been subject to price movements due to such factors as sudden changes in interest rates, changes in the financial outlook or perceived credit worthiness of securities issuers, or fluctuations in currency markets. As a result, the performance of the Fund can fluctuate moderately

over time.

Risks materially relevant not adequately captured by the indicator:

Counterparty risk: the risk of failure of financial institutions or agents (when serving as a counterparty to financial contracts) to perform their obligations, whether due to insolvency, bankruptcy or other causes.

Credit risk: the risk of loss arising from default that may occur if an issuer fails to make principal or interest payments when due. This risk is higher if the Fund holds low-rated, sub-investment-grade securities.

Derivative Instruments risk: the risk of loss in an instrument where a small change in the value of the underlying investment may have a larger impact on the value of such instrument. Derivatives may involve additional liquidity, credit and counterparty risks.

Emerging markets risk: the risk related to investing in countries that have less developed political, economic, legal and regulatory systems, and that may be impacted by political/economic instability, lack of liquidity or transparency, or safekeeping issues.

Foreign Currency risk: the risk of loss arising from exchange-rate fluctuations or due to exchange control regulations.

Liquidity risk: the risk that arises when adverse market conditions affect the ability to sell assets when necessary. Such risk may be triggered by (but not limited to) unexpected events such as environmental disasters or pandemics. Reduced liquidity may have a negative impact on the price of the assets.

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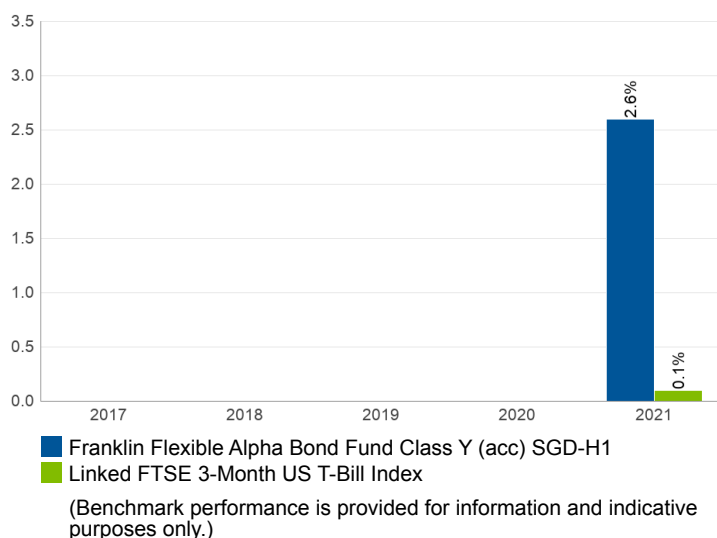
