### Objectives and Investment Policy

Franklin NextStep Balanced Growth Fund (the "Fund"), which pursues an actively managed investment strategy, aims to seek the highest level of total investment return by achieving an increase in the value of its investments and earning income over the long term.

The Fund invests mainly in units of mutual funds providing exposure to equity securities and debt securities of any quality (including lower quality securities such as unrated or non-investment grade securities) issued by governments and corporations of any size and from any country, including emerging markets, with 25% to 50% of the issuers being located or having their principal business activities in the Asia region.

Although the Fund will seek to maintain an exposure in the range of 45% to 65% to equities and equity-related securities and 35% to 55% to debt securities, these assets allocation may change from time to time based on market conditions and the investment manager's strategic and tactical asset allocation views.

The Fund can to a lesser extent (limited to 10% of assets) get exposure to alternative investments, such as real estate investment trusts (REITs).

The Fund may, indirectly (through units of mutual funds), also have limited exposure to securities in default, convertible securities and securities of companies that are, or are about to be, involved in reorganisations, financial restructurings, or bankruptcy.

The Fund may distribute income gross of expenses. Whilst this might allow

more income to be distributed, it may also have the effect of reducing capital.

The benchmark of the Fund is the Blended 30% Bloomberg Multiverse (hedged to USD) + 30% MSCI AC Asia Pacific Ex-Japan + 30% MSCI ACWI + 10% JPM GBI-EM Broad Diversified Asia Index. The benchmark is used solely as a reference for Investors to compare against the Fund's performance, and the benchmark is neither used as a constraint on how the Fund's portfolio is to be constructed nor set as a target for the Fund's performance to beat. The Fund can deviate from the benchmark.

For the distribution share class shown in this document, dividend income is distributed to shareholders.

### Terms to Understand

**Debt securities:** Securities representing the issuer's obligation to repay a loan at a specified date and to pay interest.

**Emerging markets:** Countries whose economy, stock market, political situation and regulatory framework are not fully developed.

**Equity securities:** Securities that represent an ownership stake in a company.

#### Why is the Fund in this specific category?

The Fund invests principally in units of other funds (open- and closed-end, including exchange-traded funds) providing balanced exposure to equity securities and fixed income or floating rate debt securities of issuers located anywhere in the world, including emerging markets, with a bias to the Asian Pacific region. Such investments have historically been subject to price movements due to such factors as stock market volatility, general sudden changes in interest rates, changes in the financial outlook or perceived credit worthiness of securities issuers. As a result, the performance of the Fund can fluctuate considerably over time.

#### Risks materially relevant not adequately captured by the indicator:

**Counterparty risk:** the risk of failure of financial institutions or agents (when serving as a counterparty to financial contracts) to perform their obligations, whether due to insolvency, bankruptcy or other causes.

**Credit risk:** the risk of loss arising from default that may occur if an issuer fails to make principal or interest payments when due. This risk is higher if the Fund holds low-rated, sub-investment-grade securities.

**Derivative Instruments risk:** the risk of loss in an instrument where a small change in the value of the underlying investment may have a larger impact on the value of such instrument. Derivatives may involve additional liquidity, credit and counterparty risks.

**Emerging markets risk:** the risk related to investing in countries that have less developed political, economic, legal and regulatory systems, and that may be impacted by political/economic instability, lack of liquidity or transparency, or safekeeping issues.

**Foreign Currency risk:** the risk of loss arising from exchange-rate fluctuations or due to exchange control regulations.

**Investment funds risk:** the risk that investing in other funds may be more costly or provide less liquidity than investing in underlying securities directly, or that a closed-end fund holding may trade at a premium or discount to its net asset value.

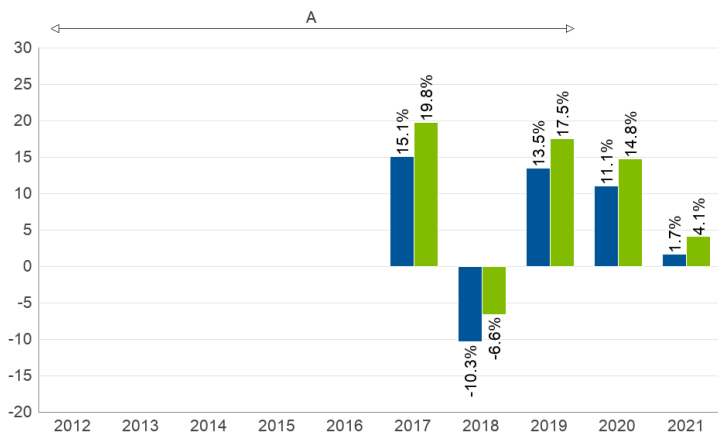
